1. Planning for May 1st planting event

2. Trees

14 trees will be planted at the May 1st planting event.

On May 1, Arbour Day, we will get a free tree from the Town of Oakville. It will be planted next to the driveway.

3. Official opening of Butterfly Garden, Friday, May 30th

The guest list has been finalized by Karen, and Jen has agreed to type it up and produce the envelopes. There are approx. 45 names in total. A copy of the master list should stay with Jen in the office for the RSVPs.

Jane's class has been working hard on creating beautiful invitations in the shape of a butterfly. The school principal has approved a sum of \$500 for the reception. This should be sufficient to cover

a selection of fruit trays, cakes, sandwiches and punch, plus rental of glasses and plates. The food will be served in the library, which will have been decorated for the volunteer tea.

The Sunningdale choir will sing 3 songs. The programme will also include Japanese dancing and a violin solo (not yet confirmed).

The Dreamacres photo album will be on view.

Slides and the two "Dig-in" videos will be running in the library.

A Guest Book will be at the front entrance for signing.

Parking will be at the front of the school (staff to be asked to park at the back on that day).

5. Toyota Evergreen Award of Excellence

Karen has received the award money and acknowledged receipt. A survey has to be completed for Toyota Evergreen, plus "before" and "after" photos of the planting event. Maggie attempted to have an article included in the Spring issue of *Education Matters* but that issue is already full. However, we will be contacted about getting an article about the award in the Fall issue.

With regard to the consideration of plant species on the Toyota Evergreen application, the committee, after careful review, reaffirmed the official position of Dreamacres, which is to continue with the mandate to naturalize the schoolyard by reintroducing native species.

6. Other business

Maggie has been invited to give a presentation about Dreamacres to school council in May. She will ask for an annual sum to be allocated to Dreamacres to use for purchases in support of our projects (such as tools, protective fencing).
