A warm welcome was extended to Mary-Lee Chisholm, a former parent at Sunningdale, who gave a short presentation on the company she works for, Energy Advantage (www.energyadvantage.com). The company assists corporations in managing and controlling their energy use and is actively seeking to develop an environmental profile in the community, by donating time to help local environmental projects, such as Dreamacres.

Maggie mentioned Evergreen's "City Stewarts" program. The goal of the program is to protect and renew nature in cities. Sunningdale was involved in this in 2003 when the Grade 4s and parents planted trees at 6^{th} Line and Glenashton Boulevard.

Mary-Lee was invited to attend the next Dreamacres meeting in January when the two National Film Board videos featuring Dreamacres will be shown.

2004 Events

Earth Day is **22 April** and we will plan some special events for the whole week. These could include guest speakers (Suzuki Foundation, Ontario Science Centre, Halton Conservation, Centre for Peace and Ecology, environmental engineers from Energy Advantage??), and possibly films with an environmental theme. We could show the two NFB videos, have Dreamacres quotes read, and organize clean up in and around the school grounds.

The spring "Dig-In" will be on Thursday, 6 May.

Grade 3's will plant the Three Sisters (beans, squash, corn) in the spring.

Grade 1s will plant potatoes and carrots.

Spring projects and their funding

The water management project at the back of the school will require considerable funding. We need a bulldozer for landscaping (possibility of getting one for free?). We will need orange fencing and T-bars, and a permanent chain link fence to close off some areas and establish perimeters. Hydroseeding will also be very costly.

Where can we find the funds? Possibilities could be Canada Trust, Friends of the Environment Foundation. We last applied for money in 2001, so perhaps we would be eligible again (Karen to contact CT). We could also try the Shell Environmental Fund again. Other possibilities are the University of Guelph and the Trillium Foundation. We could apply for money for a storage area for tools, and perhaps for fencing.

\$3,000 is to come from the Sunningdale School Council.

Thanks were extended to Karen and Ruth for a successful bulb sale in the fall. All the 840 bulbs were sold and a profit of \$240 made.
